An Act to Establish the Somerset County Advisory Budget Committee.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

8	<u>§895. Definitions</u>
10	As used in this article, unless the context otherwise
12	indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
14	 County commissioners. "County commissioners" means the county commissioners of Somerset County.
16	§896. Somerset County Advisory Budget Committee
18	In Somerset County there is established the Somerset County
20	Advisory Budget Committee to carry out the purposes of this article. The advisory budget committee consists of 9 elected
22	officials and a subcommittee of 6 nonvoting members of the county legislative delegation or their designees as provided in this
24	section.
26	1. Membership; elected officials. The 9 advisory budget committee members who are elected officials are appointed as
28	provided in this section.
30	A. Beginning with 1994, the county commissioners shall call an annual meeting of elected officials within each county
32	commissioner district not later than September 15th. A public notice of the meeting must be issued at least 10 days
34	before the meeting is held. Each commissioner shall serve as the nonvoting moderator of the meeting in that
36	commissioner's district. At the meeting, the elected officials shall nominate a slate of proposed members for the
38	advisory budget committee. Each commissioner shall select one advisory budget committee member from the slate of
40	proposed members within 7 days of the meeting, except for the selection of the initial advisory budget committee as
42	provided in subsection 3.
44	2. Membership; legislative delegation. A subcommittee of 6 members of the Somerset County legislative delegation or their
46	designees shall serve as nonvoting members of the advisory budget committee.
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50	A. The subcommittee is appointed by the chair and must be ratified by a vote of the legislative delegation.

Page 1-LR3174(1) L.D.1915 B. The subcommittee shall serve as a resource to the advisory budget committee and as a liaison to the legislative delegation.

3. Initial election. Notwithstanding subsections 1 and 5, in the initial election of the advisory budget committee in 1994, 3 members are elected from each county commissioner district. 8 One member from each district is appointed for a term of 3 years, 10 one member from each district is appointed for a term of 2 years and one member from each district is appointed for a term of one 12 year.

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4. Duties. The advisory budget committee shall review the budget estimates prepared by the county commissioners, hold public hearings in the county and submit their recommendations to the county commissioners.

5. Term of office. The term of office for an advisory budget committee member who is an elected official is 3 years, 20 only if an advisory budget committee member remains an elected 22 official in the elected official's municipality. This subsection does not apply to the initial advisory budget committee members 24 whose terms are described in subsection 3.

26 6. Vacancies. The county commissioners shall appoint an elected official to fill a vacancy occurring on the advisory budget committee. A vacancy must be filled from the commissioner 28 district in which the vacancy occurred and is for the balance of 30 the unexpired term.

32 7. Expenses. Members are not entitled to compensation, but must be reimbursed at the county rate from the county treasury for expenses authorized by the county commissioners that are 34 lawfully incurred in the performance of their duties.

<u>§897. Advisory budget committee organization</u>

The advisory budget committee shall organize and conduct its 40 meetings as follows.

42 1. Organization. The county commissioners shall direct the county clerk to call an organizational meeting of the advisory 44 budget committee not later than 60 days before the end of the county's fiscal year. At the organizational meeting, the 46 committee shall:

48 A. Elect a chair and a recording secretary from among its Sec. 1 members; and 50

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B. Adopt rules, procedures and bylaws.

2. Meetings. The advisory budget committee shall determine the time and location of the advisory budget committee meetings. The meetings must be held at times convenient for the public. The advisory budget committee shall keep minutes and record votes for every meeting. The county clerk shall issue a public notice of a meeting not later than 7 days before the meeting is held.

3. Resources. The county commissioners shall provide the advisory budget committee with necessary clerical assistance, office expenses and suitable meeting space, as well as access to county files and information.

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<u>§898. Budget procedures</u>

Proposed budget. The county commissioners shall submit
 an itemized budget estimate, as described in sections 701, 702
 and 7503, to the advisory budget committee in a timely fashion,
 not later than 60 days before the end of the county's fiscal year.

22 2. Budget review process. The advisory budget committee shall review the proposed itemized budget prepared by the county
 24 commissioners, together with any supplementary material prepared by the head of each county department or provided by an
 26 independent board or institution or another governmental agency. The advisory budget committee may advise that the proposed budget
 28 be increased, decreased, altered or revised, only if:

- A. The advisory budget committee enters into its minutes an explanation for the recommended change in the estimated
 expenditures and revenues as initially presented by the county commissioners; and
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B. The total estimated revenues, together with the amount of county tax to be levied, equals the total estimated expenditures.

3. Public hearing. The advisory budget committee shall
40 hold at least 2 public hearings in the county on the proposed budget before the end of the county's fiscal year and before the
42 commissioners finally approve the budget. At least one public hearing must be held in the northern part of the county and at
44 least one public hearing must be held in the southern part of the county. Notice of the hearing must be given at least 10 days
46 before the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation within the county.

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4. Written notification. Written notice and a copy of the proposed budget must be sent at least 10 days before the public

Page 3-LR3174(1) L.D.1915 hearing to the clerk of each municipality in the county. The municipal clerk shall notify the elected officials of the proposed budget.

5. Approval of budget. After the public hearings are completed, the advisory budget committee shall submit its recommendations to the county commissioners for approval not later than the end of the county's fiscal year, subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed in subsection 2.

6. Legislative approval. Before January 15th of the fiscal year for which the budget is prepared, the county commissioners shall submit the budget to the Legislature. The Legislature 14 shall approve, disapprove or amend the budget as submitted.

16 7. Interim budget. If the budget is not approved before the start of a fiscal year, until a budget is finally adopted, 18 the county shall operate on an interim budget, which may not exceed the previous year's budget.

8. Transfer of funds. The county commissioners may
 22 transfer funds as provided in section 922.

24 §899. Filing of county budget

A copy of the final budget and subsequent amendments must be filed, on forms approved by the Department of Audit, with the
 State Auditor, who shall retain them for 3 years.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes the Somerset County Advisory Budget 34 Committee.

40 This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical
 42 amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.

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
