Sec. 2. Commission established. The Unorganized Territory Education and Services Fund Study Commission, referred to in this section as the "commission," is established.

1. Commission membership. The commission consists of 11 46 members:

A. Two members of the committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over taxation matters appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

D. Four members of the public who are taxpayers in the unorganized territory appointed by the Governor.

2. Appointments and meetings. All appointments must be 16 made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this Act.

The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by the appointing authorities once the selection is made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than 30 days after the appointment of all members has been completed. The commission shall select a chair from its members.

26 з. Duties. The commission shall review and analyze all aspects of establishing the municipal cost component for the unorganized territories. The commission shall examine ways to 28 ensure improved legislative oversight as well as review agency 30 accountability to the Unorganized Territory Education and Services Fund including, but not limited to, an examination of 32 county service costs, reporting and auditing, school construction and teacher retirement costs, state agency service costs, unexpended balances and cash flow requirements and overall 34 administration of the program.

The commission shall evaluate the findings of their review 38 and make recommendations to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of establishing and administering the municipal cost 40 component for unorganized territories.

The fiscal administrator of the unorganized territory, the Bureau of Taxation, the Department of Education and Cultural Services, the 20 Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, the Department of Audit and the Division of Forest Fire Control of the Maine Forest Service 22 shall provide additional staff support upon request of the commission. 24

26 Reimbursement. The members of the commission who are 6. Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined 28 in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's commission hearings. attendance at All other members are 30 entitled to expenses, as defined in Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 379, upon application to the Executive Director of the 32 Legislative Council.

 7. Report. The commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the
First Regular Session of the 117th Legislature and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
taxation matters no later than November 15, 1994.

Sec. 3. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

#### General Fund

30 Section 1 of this bill establishes the state costs for administering the unorganized territory in fiscal year 1994-95, but does not affect General Fund revenues or appropriations. 32 The revenues and appropriations associated with the municipal cost component of the unorganized territory are already accounted for 34 budget with the exception of the General in the Fund appropriation in section 3 of this bill. The costs established 36 in this bill are incorporated into the tax assessment for the 38 unorganized territory.

Section 3 of the bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$9,140 in fiscal year 1994-95 to provide funding for the per 42 diems, travel expenses and operating costs of the Unorganized Territory Education and Services Fund Study Commission. The total cost of the study commission will be reimbursed from the municipal cost component for unorganized territory services as provided by law, increasing General Fund revenues by \$9,140 in fiscal year 1994-95.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment establishes the Unorganized Territory Education and Services Fund Study Commission that reviews all aspects of the administration, budgeting and assessment of the municipal cost component of the unorganized territory.

This amendment requires that the 1994-95 tax assessment be reduced by another \$700,000 from surplus funds in the account.
