HOUSE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1417, L.D. 1931, Bill, "An Act to Promote Integrity in the Citizens Petition Process"

18 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its 20 place the following:

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'Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §903-B is enacted to read:

24 <u>§903-B. Registration; reporting</u>

The following provisions govern registration and reporting for the circulation of initiative or referendum petitions.

 Registration. An organization formed to obtain
signatures for an initiative or referendum petition shall register the name of a member of that organization and the ballot
guestion with the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices. No later than 10 days after the organization to
gather signatures for initiative or referendum petitions is formed and before accepting contributions, making expenditures or
incurring obligations, the organization shall name a treasurer.

38 2. Reporting. Upon being named pursuant to subsection 1, the treasurer shall immediately report to the Commission on 40 Governmental Ethics and Election Practices the method for compensating persons working on the initiative or referendum 42 petition. If persons are compensated on the basis of each signature gathered, the treasurer shall also report the payment 44 schedule to the commission.

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3. Changes in registration and reporting information. A 2 change in the information required by this section to be reported to the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices must be reported within 10 days of the date of the change. 4 4. Person. For purposes of this section, "person" has the б same meaning as in section 1001. 8 Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §904-A is enacted to read: 10 §904-A. Payment for signature; prohibition 12 A circulator of an initiative or a referendum petition or a 14 person who causes the circulation of an initiative or referendum petition may not pay or offer to pay any compensation to a person for the person's signature on the initiative or referendum 16 petition.' 18 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 20 statement of fact the following **'FISCAL NOTE** 22 24 The Department of the Secretary of State will incur some minor additional costs to enforce the prohibition for circulators of initiative and referendum petitions to compensate a person for 26 the person's signature. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources. 28 30 The Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices will incur some minor costs to handle the additional registration 32 and reporting responsibilities. These costs can be absorbed within the commission's existing budgeted resources.' 34 36 STATEMENT OF FACT 38 This amendment replaces the original bill. 40 The amendment prohibits a person who collects signatures for 42 initiative or referendum petition from compensating or an offering to compensate a person for the person's signature. 44 The amendment also establishes registration and reporting 46 requirements for initiative or referendum petition drives. The amendment requires a treasurer to be named no later than 10 days after an organization for a petition drive is formed and before 48 the organization accepts contributions, makes expenditures or

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incurs obligations. The treasurer shall immediately report the method of compensation for persons gathering signatures for the petition drive. If payment is made per signature gathered, the treasurer shall also report the payment schedule. All reports required under this section must be made to the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
