Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §401, sub-§§2 and 3, as amended by PL 1989, c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, are further amended to read:

- 2. County commissioners' duties. The county commissioners shall regularly review the sheriff's operations and shall ensure that the law enforcement functions required under the budget are being adequately performed. For Kennebec County, the sheriff's department must demonstrate a need and receive approval of the county commissioners for any expansion or increase in services.

 The county commissioners may not give orders directly to any deputies or other subordinates of the sheriff, either publicly or privately.
 - Meetings with municipal officers; State Police. least annually, the county commissioners and sheriff shall hold a special meeting for reviewing county law enforcement activities; except that, for Kennebec County, these meetings must be held semiannually. The county commissioners shall set a date, time and place for this meeting and inform the sheriff and all municipal officers, including all municipal police chiefs within the county, of the meeting at least one week in advance. meetings in Kennebec County must include the State Police. purpose of this-meeting these meetings is to review activities of department, sheriff's to coordinate enforcement law activities throughout the county and, to resolve problems in law enforcement and to avoid duplicated services.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the Kennebec County Sheriff to demonstrate a need and receive approval of the county commissioners for any expansion or increase in services. The bill also provides that the Kennebec County Commissioners and sheriff must meet twice a year to review county law enforcement activity and that the State Police must be included in the meeting.
