10	§9101. Definitions		
12	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.		
14	1. Alternative form of regulation. "Alternative form of		
16	regulation" means a form of regulation that includes, but need not be restricted to, rate base or rate of return regulation to		
18	be developed by the commission. The term includes the use of any index, formula, rate stability plan, range of freedom,		
20	streamlined form of regulation or deregulation of services or entities when regulation is not required to protect the public		
22	interest or to accomplish the specific objectives set forth in this chapter.

26	§9102. Adoption of alternative form of regulation		
	The commission shall adopt, after public hearings and other		
28	processes the commission determines appropriate, an alternative form of regulation for all telephone utilities in the State with		
30	gross sales of over \$4,000,000 and who provide local telephone service to the majority of residential customers within their		
32	service territory. The alternative form of regulation must		
34	conform to the requirements of chapters 71, 73, 75, 87 and 89, but need not conform with chapter 3 to the extent that the		
	provisions of chapter 3 are determined to require the use of rate		
36	base, rate of return regulation or any other specific form of regulation of the rates of a telephone utility or to the extent		
38	that the provisions of chapter 3 are determined to give any		
40	party, including the telephone utility, the right to petition to change rates for telecommunications services. However, nothing		
42	in this chapter may be construed to limit the authority of the commission under section 1322.		
44	§9103. Conditions of the alternative form of regulation		
46	In determining the alternative form of regulation adopted pursuant to section 9102, the commission shall seek the following		
48	objectives.		
50	1. Alternative regulation; period. For the period of the		
50	alternative form of regulation, which may not be less than 5		

	years nor exceed 10 years without affirmative reauthorization by		
2	the commission, ratepayers as a whole, and residential and small		
	business ratepayers in particular, are not likely to be required		
4	to pay more for local telephone services over the period under		
_	the alternative form of regulation than they would under		
6	traditional rate base or rate of return regulation.		
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8	2. Costs. The costs of regulation of telephone utilities		
10	will be less under the alternative form of regulation than under		
10	rate base or rate of return regulation.		
12	3. Mandates. The alternative form of regulation will		
	preserve the ability of the commission to ensure that all		
14	legislative and commission mandates directed to the telephone		
	utility are properly executed.

	4. Safequards. The alternative form of regulation must		
18	provide adequate safeguards to ensure that risks associated with		
	the development, deployment and offering of telecommunications		
20	and related services offered by the telephone utility, other than		
	local telephone services, are not borne by the local telephone		
22	service subscribers of the telephone utility and that the utility		
	continues to offer a flat-rate, voice-only local service option.

	5. Other objectives. In determining the alternative form		
26	of regulation the commission shall also seek to:		
28	A. Ensure that customers pay only reasonable charges for		
	local telephone services;

12	§9104. Implementation		
14	The commission shall conclude, within 12 months of the		
	effective date of this chapter, a proceeding designed to		
16	implement an alternative form of regulation for telephone		

utilities in the State affected by this chapter.

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§9105. Report to the Legislature

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The commission shall provide to the Legislature, on an annual basis beginning September 1, 1995, a report describing the activities of the commission pursuant to this chapter and the extent to which the alternative form of regulation has achieved the objectives of this chapter.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill directs the Public Utilities Commission to adopt an alternative form of regulation of large telephone utilities in the State that preserves affordable universal service while encouraging the development of new and expanded telecommunications services in the State.

This document has not yet been reviewed to determine the need for cross-reference, stylistic and other technical amendments to conform existing law to current drafting standards.
