'For each pupil enrolled during the year of allocation, the State provides to the school the adjusted tuition and insured value factor amount described in section 5805, subsection 3. This amount must be provided in 4 equal payments and the payments must be made quarterly during the year of attendance. The first payment must be made by August 31st. The total amount provided for all pupils is limited to the amount appropriated for this purpose.'

'1. Membership. In appointing members to the board of trustees, the Governor shall give proper consideration to achieving statewide geographical representation and gender equity. The board of trustees consists of 18 voting members and one nonvoting member as follows:'

16. Report. To report biennially to the Governor and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters on the results of the assessment in subsection 15 by the board of trustees and the general status of the school.'

'2. Courses of study: programs; plan. By February 15, 1995, a plan must be submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters that outlines the statewide education programs provided by the school and guarantees opportunities and access to students and educators not residing full time at the school.

The plan, to be implemented in September 1995, must include, but is not limited to, offering short courses, workshops, seminars, weekend instructional programs, distance learning and various other programs of short duration for teachers and students. The plan may include other innovative programs that meet the purpose of the school and assist in the professional development of the State's science and mathematics teachers.'

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The amendment makes the following changes to the bill:

- 1. Makes clear that the State will fund 100% of the costs of the Maine School of Science and Mathematics;
- Makes clear that the State will make 4 equal payments to
 the school on a quarterly basis, beginning on August 31st of each year;
- 3. Makes clear that the Governor will consider geographical representation and gender equity in appointing members to the Board of Trustees of the Maine School of Science and Mathematics and the Task Force of the Maine School of Visual and Performing Arts;
 - Adds 2 teachers to the board of trustees of the school;
 - Adds a requirement that one of the 8 public members of the board of trustees of the school have expertise in instructional television;
 - 6. Adds a requirement that the board of trustees of the school develop methods of assessing student academic achievement and teacher development and report to the Governor and the Legislature on those and other matters related to the school every 2 years;
 - 7. Adds a requirement that the school provide access to pupils and teachers not residing full time at the school beginning in September 1955. A plan outlining courses, workshops, seminars and other instructional programs must be submitted to the Legislature by February 15, 1995;
 - 8. Adjusts the membership of the Task Force on the Maine School of Visual and Performing Arts by replacing a representative from the University of Southern Maine with the Chancellor of the University of Maine System, or the chancellor's designee, and replacing an art education teacher and a music education teacher with 3 members of the Maine Art Education Association; and
 - 9. Adds a fiscal note.
