An Act to Increase the Efficiency of the Appointment Process for Occupational or Professional Regulatory Boards.

Reported by Senator CLEVELAND of Androscoggin for the Joint Standing Committee on Audit and Program Review pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, chapter 33. Reference to the Committee on Audit and Program Review suggested and ordered printed pursuant to Joint Rule 20.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §8007 is enacted to read:

<u>§8007. Reappointment</u>

A member of an occupational or professional regulatory board 8 listed in section 8001 or 8001-A who is eligible for reappointment is automatically reappointed upon the expiration of 10 that member's term unless the Governor objects to the reappointment. In the event of objection, the Governor must make an appointment to fill the position of the member whose term has 12 expired within 8 months of the term's expiration. If the 14appointment is not made within this period, the board with the vacant position shall notify the Legislative Council, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 16 business legislation matters and the joint standing committee of 18 the Legislature having jurisdiction over audit and program review that the vacancy has not been filled.

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The Governor must make an appointment within 8 months of the expiration of a term of a member of an occupational or professional regulatory board listed in section 8001 or 8001-A who is not eligible for reappointment. If the appointment is not made within this period, the board with the vacant position shall notify the Legislative Council, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over business legislation matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over audit and program review that the vacancy has not been filled.

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FISCAL NOTE

Automatic reappointment of certain board members should 36 result in some minor savings in the Executive Department.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill authorizes automatic reappointment for certain members of occupational or professional regulatory boards, unless the Governor objects to the reappointment. The bill is intended 44 to save time, money and resources in the appointment process and 46 achieve timely reappointments in order to ensure that these boards function according to legislative intent. İf the 48 appointment is not made within 8 months of the term's expiration following objection to automatic reappointment or for a member 50 not eligible for reappointment, the board with the vacancy must make certain notifications.

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
