This bill will increase dedicated revenue to the State Bureau of Identification within the Department of Public Safety by \$240,000 in fiscal year 1994-95 from the \$6 fee per background The bureau will require an allocation of \$179,345 in fiscal year 1994-95 to establish one Senior Programmer Analyst one Identification Specialist II position, position, Identification Specialist I position, 2 Data Entry Specialist and general operation expenses to perform background investigation services.

Licensing and Enforcement within Division of Department of Public Safety will receive additional dedicated revenue of \$157,500 in fiscal year 1994-95 from the \$2.25 fees paid when the division's central communications service is used and \$6.75 when the division performs the entire background check. The division will require an allocation of \$146,306 in fiscal year 1994-95 to provide funds for 2 Clerk Typist II positions, one Account Clerk II position and general operating expenses to assist in the background check process.

Local police departments will receive an estimated \$202,500 in fiscal year 1994-95 to cover their costs associated with their involvement in these background checks.' '

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment incorporates the statutory language from Committee Amendment "A" but also deletes the emergency preamble and the emergency clause from the bill and replaces allocation section and fiscal note of the amendment.
