HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 773, L.D. 1996, "Resolve, to Establish a Commission on the Future of Maine's Paper Industry"

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 8 and inserting in its place the following:

Sec. 8. Reimbursement. Resolved: That members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2 for each day's attendance at commission meetings; and be it further'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of the fiscal note and inserting in its place the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The miscellaneous expenses incurred by the Commission on the Future of Maine's Paper Industry can be absorbed by the Legislature within existing budgeted resources. If Legislators meet the qualification requirements and are appointed to the commission, additional General Fund appropriations for the per diem and expenses of these Legislators will be required. The amounts will depend on the number of Legislators appointed.'


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HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 773, L.D. 1996

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment removes the language that entitles members who are not state employees to reimbursement for expenses. The amendment also replaces the fiscal note.
