An Act Concerning Plastic Holding Devices.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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#### Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §18, sub-§2-B is enacted to read:

2-B. Vending machines; recycling connectors. Distributors of products connected by plastic holding devices shall ensure that any plastic holding devices removed from those products for the purpose of loading the products into a vending machine are collected and are either recycled by the distributor or delivered 10 by the distributor to a person engaged in recycling plastics.

Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §18, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 341, §2, is amended to read:

з. Repeal. This section is repealed 90 days after the 16 adjournment of the Second Regular Session of the 116th 117th Legislature.

Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §18-A, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 341, 20 §3, is amended to read:

22 4. Effective date. This section takes effect 90 days after the adjournment of the Second Regular Session of the 116th 117th 24 Legislature.

26 Sec. 4. Report. By February 1, 1996, persons who distribute in the State plastic holding devices or products that are connected by plastic holding devices shall report to the Maine 28 Waste Management Agency the number of plastic holding devices 30 distributed by those persons in the State between the effective date of this Act and December 31, 1995. That report must also include the number of those plastic holding devices that was 32 collected and recycled after removal from products sold in 34 vending machines. By March 1, 1996, the Maine Waste Management Agency shall analyze that data and submit a report to the joint 36 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy and natural resource matters on the total number of plastic holding devices distributed in the State between the 38 effective date of this Act and December 31, 1995, the percent of 40 that total that was collected and recycled after removal from products sold in vending machines and the agency's estimate of 42 the percent of that total that was recycled through voluntary programs, the percent that was reused and the percent that was 44 distributed but was not otherwise reported as collected or recycled. In preparing its report, the agency shall consult with interested parties, including the Maine Grocers Association and 46 the Maine Municipal Association.

Sec. 5. Committee legislation authorized. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy and natural resource matters may report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 117th Legislature on any matter pertaining to plastic holding devices.

### FISCAL NOTE

10 The Maine Waste Management Agency will incur some minor additional costs to analyze certain data and to submit a required 12 report to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the agency's existing budgeted resources.

The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources may 16 realize some minor savings from the delayed implementation of the department's enforcement responsibilities pertaining to the ban 18 on the sale of products connected by plastic holding devices.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

24 This bill is reported unanimously by the Joint Standing Committee on Energy and Natural Resources pursuant to Public Law 26 1993, chapter 341, section 7.

28 This bill postpones for 2 years the effective date on the the sale of products connected by plastic holding ban on 30 The bill also requires distributors of products devices. connected by plastic holding devices that are sold in vending machines to collect the plastic holding devices removed from 32 those products and ensure that they are collected and recycled. The bill also requires that distributors of plastic holding 34 devices or products connected by plastic holding devices report to the Maine Waste Management Agency by February 1, 1996 on the 36 number of devices distributed in the State and the number collected and recycled after removal from products sold in 38 The agency is required to analyze that data vending machines. and report statewide totals to the Joint Standing Committee on 40 Energy and Natural Resources by April 1, 1996.

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The bill also authorizes the Joint Standing Committee on 44 Energy and Natural Resources to report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 117th Legislature on any matter 46 pertaining to plastic holding devices.
