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26	Further amend the resolution by striking out everything after the title and inserting in its place the following:
28	'WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Maine, now assembled in the
30	First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the Congress of the United States, as follows:
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34	WHEREAS, President Clinton has proposed to the Congress a budget resolution that includes a broad-based energy tax based on the British Thermal Unit equivalent of various energy sources and
36	an additional supplemental tax on oil; and
38	WHEREAS, such a supplemental tax on oil would impose a disproportionate burden on New England households, which are
40	particularly dependent on the use of home heating oil; and

WHEREAS, the Senate has amended such a budget resolution to remove the supplemental tax on oil from heating fuels; and

WHEREAS, the Congress still must reconcile House and Senate versions of the budget resolution and must enact implementing legislation to place the BTU tax in statute; and

	shared burden on household budgets, but will also reduce the far
4	greater long-term burden of the uncontrolled federal deficit; and
6	WHEREAS, continued failure to control the deficit will risk renewed inflation, undercut economic recovery and delay the
8	return to full employment; now, therefore, be it
10	RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, support the action taken by the Senate to remove the supplemental tax on home
12	heating oil; and be it further
14	RESOLVED: That we respectfully recommend and urge the Congress of the United States to join a spirit of bipartisan
16	cooperation to pass a responsible budget in which all Americans share equally the burden of sacrifice; and be it further
