	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA c. 199 is enacted to read:

U	RESIDENT STATE POLICE OFFICERS
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	<u>§1701. Resident state police officers for municipalities</u>
10	without police force
12	The Chief of the State Police may, within available
1, 24	appropriations, appoint suitable persons from the regular state
14	police force as resident state police officers in addition to the
	regular state police force, to be employed and empowered as state
16	police officers in any municipality, or 2 or more adjoining
	municipalities, lacking an organized police force and those
18	officers may be detailed by the Chief of the State Police as
	resident state police officers for regular assignment to those
20	municipalities. Each municipality shall pay all direct costs of
	compensation, maintenance and other expenses of the state police
22	officers detailed to the municipality. The municipality or
24	municipalities and the Chief of the State Police are authorized to enter into agreements and contracts for resident state police
24	services, for periods not exceeding 3 years. Such agreements may
26	be renewable for additional terms. Any agreement or contract is
-•	subject to approval as to form by the Attorney General and is
28	subject to an annual nonappropriation clause. The Chief of the
	State Police may exercise such supervision and direction over any
30	resident police officer so appointed as the Chief of the State
	Police determines necessary, and each appointee is required to
32	conform to the requirements of chapter 191. Each resident state
• •	police officer has the same powers as officers of the regular
34	state police force and is entitled to the same rights and subject
36	to the same rules and regulations as apply to regular state police officers as established by the Bureau of State Police
30	within the Department of Public Safety. The Bureau of State
38	Police is authorized to promulgate such additional rules and
50	regulations as are reasonably necessary to carry out this program.

44	This bill authorizes the provision of resident state police
