2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §5 is enacted to read:**

6 **§5. Bill submission**

8 **1. Limitation.** A member of the Legislature may submit a
10 total of 10 bills for introduction during each regular session of
12 the legislative biennium.

14 **2. Exception.** Nothing in this section may be construed to
16 limit the number of bills that may be submitted by the Governor
18 or the Executive Department.

20 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

22 This bill limits the number of bills that a Legislator may
sponsor during each legislative session but allows an exception
for the number of bills that may be submitted by the Governor and
the Executive Department.
