An Act to Reduce the Meal Allowance for Legislators from \$32 to \$16.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §2, 3rd and 10th ¶¶, as amended by PL 1989, c. 878, Pt. D, \S 14 and 15, are further amended to read:

б Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall be is entitled to a meal allowance in the amount of \$32 \$16 and a 8 housing allowance in the amount of \$38 for each day in attendance at sessions of the Legislature and for each day the member 10 occupies overnight accommodations away from either home immediately preceding or immediately following attendance at 12 daily sessions of the Legislature. In lieu of the meal and housing allowance, each member shall-be is entitled to a daily 14 meal allowance in the amount of \$32 \$16 and actual daily mileage allowances in an amount up to but not exceeding \$38 per day. 16 Each member of the Senate shall also receives an annual allowance for constituent services in the amount of \$1,000, \$650 18 of which shall--be is received at the start of each regular session and \$350 of which shall--be is received in the month 20 following adjournment of the regular session. Each member of the House of Representatives shall also receives an annual 22 allowance for constituent services in the amount of \$750, \$500 of which shall-be is received at the start of each regular session 24 and \$250 of which shall-be is received in the month following adjournment of the regular session. 26

The President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the floor leaders and their assistants and 28 members of a committee, with the approval of the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives as to 30 members of a committee, may also meet on days when the 32 Legislature is not in daily session at any convenient location within the State. Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall--receive receives \$55 for every day's 34 attendance when meetings or daily sessions are held, a meal allowance in the amount of \$32 <u>\$16</u> and a housing allowance 36 whereby where actual lodging expenses will be reimbursed at the single-room rate, provided-that if a receipt is submitted to the 38 Executive Director of the Legislative Council for each day in attendance at such meetings or daily sessions and for each day 40 that member occupies overnight accommodations away from home either immediately preceding or immediately following attendance 42 at daily sessions of the Legislature and actual daily mileage allowances which shall-be are paid at the same rate paid to state 44 employees. In lieu of the meal and housing allowance, each member 46 shall-be is entitled to a daily meal allowance in the amount of \$32 <u>\$16</u> and actual daily mileage allowances.
