COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 21, L.D. 52

The use of stickers to label refundable beverage containers may decrease over-redemptions and result in net increases of dedicated revenue to the Maine Solid Waste Management Fund. The amount can not be determined at this time. The Governor's proposed current services budget includes changes that may affect this bill's impact on the Maine Solid Waste Management Fund. This estimate of the fiscal impact may need to be adjusted based on final legislative actions on the current services budget.'

The bill allows nonrefillable containers from exclusive distributorships to have their refund value and the state identification indicated by stickers. This amendment qualifies this provision by stating that stickers may be used only on bottles not otherwise marked. The amendment also requires redemption centers to accept containers with either form of marking.
