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- Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §1053, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1989, c. 504, §25 and 31, is further amended to read:
- 1. Identification of committee. The names and mailing addresses of the committee, its treasurer, its principal officers and the identity of any candidate fer-any-constitutional-effice er who is registered under section 1013-A and who is involved in decision making for a political action committee organized to advance the election of that candidate;

### Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §1063 is enacted to read:

§1063. Constitutional officers and State Auditor

The Secretary of State, the Treasurer of State, the Attorney General, the State Auditor, or any candidate for those offices, may not form a political action committee or be involved in decision making for or solicit contributions to a political action committee.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits the Secretary of State, the Treasurer of State, the Attorney General, the State Auditor, or any candidate for those offices, from forming political action committees, or PACs, and from being involved in decision making for a PAC or soliciting contributions to a PAC.
