An Act to Change the Dates on Which Primary Elections are Held and Certain Nomination Papers May be Signed.

The registrar in the candidate's 14 municipality of residence must certify to that fact upon the petition. 16 Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §335, sub-§§6 and 8, as enacted by PL 1985, 18 c. 161, §6, are amended to read: 20 6. When signed. A petition may not be signed before January April 1st of the election year in which it is to be used. 22 8. When filed. Time and nature of election 32 The primary election shall must be held on the 2nd first Tuesday of-June after the first Monday in September of each general election year and is considered to be a separate election 34 for each party which that takes part in it. This includes the duties of public officials in announcing the election, providing 36 forms and ballots, keeping records and any other matter necessary to effect the purpose of a primary election. Notice to Secretary of State. If no notice is received by that date, only voters enrolled in a political party may vote in that party's 52 primary.

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Sec. 5. 21-A MRSA §354, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, 2 §6, is amended to read:

6. When signed. A nomination petition may not be signed before January April 1st of the election year in which it is to
be used.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill changes the date of primary elections in Maine from the 2nd Tuesday in June to the 1st Tuesday after the 1st Monday in September. The dates for signing and filing primary petitions are also changed to maintain the same amount of time between the signing and filing of the petition and the primary as 16 under current law.

18 The bill also changes the date for signing nomination petitions for unenrolled candidates to correspond with the dates 20 of signing petitions for enrolled candidates.
