RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Require the Popular Election of the Secretary of State.

Reference to the Committee on State and Local Government suggested and ordered printed.

2	Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:
6	Constitution, Art. V, Part Second, §§1 and 1-A are amended to read:
8 10 12	Section 1. Election. The Until the 1998 general election, the Secretary of State shall be chosen biennially at the first session of the Legislature, by joint ballot of the Senators and Representatives in convention.
14 16 . 18	Section 1-A. Succession to the office of Secretary of State. If Until the 1998 general election, if a vacancy occurs in the office of the Secretary of State, the first deputy secretary of state shall act as the Secretary of State until a Secretary of State is elected by the Legislature during the current session if in session, or at the next regular or special session.
22	Constitution, Art. V, Part Second, §§1-B and 1-C are enacted to read:
24 26 28	Section 1-B. Election. Beginning with the 1998 general election, the Secretary of State must be chosen every 4 years by popular election on the same date and in the same manner as provided by this Constitution for the election of the Governor.
30 32 34 36	Section 1-C. Succession to the office of Secretary of State. Beginning with the 1998 general election, if a vacancy occurs in the office of the Secretary of State, the first deputy secretary of state shall act as Secretary of State until a Secretary of State is elected at the next statewide election. A Secretary of State elected under this section to fill a vacancy serves until the next general election at which a Governor is elected.

40 42	Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and
44 46	plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at the next statewide election in the month of November following passage of this resolution, to vote upon
48	the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to provide that the Secretary of State be elected by the people every 4 years in the same manner as the Governor is elected?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.
