30 Commissioner of Human Services;

32 Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife;

34 Commissioner of Labor;

38 Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation;

40 Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation;

42 Commissioner of Public Safety; and

44 Commissioner of Transportation.

46 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

This bill provides for the renomination and reconfirmation of cabinet-level commissioners in the executive branch at the beginning of each term of the Governor.
