## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1919, as repealed and replaced by PL 1981, 4 c. 318, §4, is amended to read:

6 **§1919. Fees** 

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8 An applicant for an official business directional sign shall pay to the commissioner an initial license fee not to exceed \$30 10 <u>\$10</u> for each sign, and an annual renewal fee not to exceed \$30 <u>\$10</u>. The amount of each fee shall <u>must</u> be determined for each 12 year by the commissioner in advance of such year and shall <u>must</u> approximate to the extent practicable the amount computed by 14 dividing the cost of the administration of the official business directional sign program by the number of signs in existence in 16 the prior licensing year.

18 The fees so collected by the commissioner shall <u>must</u> be deposited with the Treasurer of State and appropriated to carry 20 out this chapter. Such <u>These</u> funds shall <u>do</u> not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

26 Under current law, the initial license fee for an official business directional sign may not exceed \$30, and the annual renewal fee may not exceed \$30. This bill reduces both those fees to an amount not to exceed \$10.

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
