	This bill confers upon United States Border Patrol agents,
16	inspectors and investigators of the Immigration and
	Naturalization Service of the Department of Justice and officers
18	of the United States Customs Service of the Department of the
	Treasury the statutory authority to enforce Maine law.
20	Notwithstanding the lack of authority, these federal law
	enforcement officers are presented with serious violations of
22	traffic and criminal statutes that require immediate action and currently assist state, county and local law enforcement agencies
