22	'Effective January 1, 1996, the minimum wage is \$4.60 per hour.
24	Effective January 1, 1997, the minimum wage is \$4.00 per hour. If the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess of the
26	minimum wage established under this section, the minimum wage must be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date
28	as the increase in the federal minimum wage, but in no case may the minimum wage exceed \$5.15 per hour.'

18	This amendment amends the state minimum wage and places additional responsibilities on the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards in the area of required distribution of posters.
20	A General Fund appropriation of \$11,259 in fiscal year 1995-96 in required for publishing costs and other operating expense related to revising the minimum wage poster.
22	
24	The increases in the minimum wage may result in increased costs to municipalities if there are school and other public
26	employees who are compensated at less than the higher minimum wage levels. Increased school expenses may increase funding
28	requests for the General Purpose Aid for Local Schools program.'

32	STATEMENT OF FACT
	This amendment provides that the state minimum wage will
34	increase to \$4.60 per hour in 1996 and \$4.95 per hour in 1997 or to the level of the federal minimum wage, if that is higher, up
36	to a maximum of \$5.15 per hour.
