An Act to Privatize the Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory within the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §568, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 499, §2 and 4 affected by §26, is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

By June 1, 1997 and June 1st of every succeeding year, the8State Treasurer shall transfer \$50,000 from the Health and
Environmental Testing Laboratory Special Revenue Account to the10General Fund.

12 Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §569 is enacted to read:

 Beginning July 1, 1996, the department shall contract for the performance of the services and duties of the Health and
Environmental Testing Laboratory.

 1. Process for bidding, awards and contracts. All contracts must be bid and awarded and the contracts entered into
by the Bureau of General Services in accordance with the competitive bid process contained in Title 5, chapter 155,
subchapter I-A.

 26 2. Involvement of the department. The Bureau of General Services shall consult with the department prior to requesting
28 bids and shall review all bids with the department prior to awarding contracts.

3. Contract information. The department shall provide to 32 the Bureau of General Services for use in the competitive bid process a description of the services currently provided and a 34 description of the services required to be performed during the next contract period.

4. Contract period. The time period for the first contract 38 must be 3 years.

 40 5. Report. By January 1, 1999, and every 2 years thereafter, the department shall report to the joint standing
42 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters on the terms and performance of any
44 contract entered into under this section.

 46 <u>6. Conditions precedent.</u> The requirement of this section that the department use a competitive bid process for the
48 <u>services and duties of the Health and Environmental Testing</u> Laboratory takes effect only if the following conditions are met:
50 A. By October 5, 1995, the department shall submit to the2Bureau of General Services information stating the costs of
the Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory and the4projected costs during the first contract period;

 B. By January 1, 1996, the Bureau of General Services shall submit a report on the use of a competitive bid process for
the services and duties of the Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory to the joint standing committee of the
Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters. The report must document savings to the
department from the use of the competitive bid process of \$50,000 per year; and

C. By February 1, 1996, the joint standing committee of the16Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local
government matters shall review the report of the Bureau of18General Services and a majority of those members present and
voting must vote to approve using the competitive bid20process. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council
shall provide to the department, the Bureau of General22Services and the Revisor of Statutes a copy of the record of
the vote of approval.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes a competitive bid process for the Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory of the Department of Human Services. It places responsibility for the bid process in the Bureau of General Services. It requires a report to the State and Local Government Committee documenting that savings of \$50,000 per year are possible and a vote of the committee approving the use of the competitive bid process in order for the legislation to take effect. It requires \$50,000 per year to be transferred from the Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory Special Revenue Account to the General Fund.
