Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3923-A, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 657, §23, is further amended to read:

- 1. Dogs capable of producing young. A dog owner or keeper shall pay a fee of \$7.75 to the municipal clerk for each dog 6 months of age or older and capable of producing young. A dog is considered capable of producing young unless certification under subsection 2 is provided.
- The clerk shall retain \$1 \$1.25 as a recording fee and pay the remaining \$6.50 to the department for deposit in the Animal Welfare Fund.
- Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §3923-A, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 468, §12, is amended to read:
- 2. Dogs incapable of producing young. A dog owner shall pay a fee of \$4 \ \frac{\$4.25}{} \] to the municipal clerk for each dog 6 months of age or older and incapable of producing young. A dog is considered incapable of producing young when the owner provides the following:
- A. A written certificate issued by a veterinarian stating that the veterinarian has neutered the dog;
- B. A written certificate issued by a veterinarian stating that the veterinarian has examined the dog and determined that the dog is incapable of producing young; or
- 32 C. A previous license stating that the dog is incapable of producing young.

- The clerk shall retain \$1 \$1.25 as a recording fee, deposit \$1 in the municipality's animal welfare account established in accordance with section 3945 and pay the remaining \$2 to the department for deposit in the Animal Welfare Fund.
- Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §3923-B, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 657, §25, is further amended to read:
- 1. Dog tags. The municipal clerk shall provide with each new license issued under section 3923-A a dog tag, indicating the year the license is issued and bearing other information prescribed by the department, and a sticker, indicating the year the license is issued, which must be attached to the back of the dog tag. The dog tag remains with the dog for as long as the dog is kept in the licensing municipality. The owner or keeper shall make sure that the tag is securely attached to a collar of leather, metal or material of comparable strength and that the

	collar is worn at all times by the dog for which the license was
2	issued, except as provided in subsection 3.
4	If a sticker and tag is lost or the owner has moved to a
