Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 27. Reference to the Committee on State and Local Government suggested and ordered printed.

Presented by Speaker GWADOSKY of Fairfield. Cosponsored by Senator: BUTLAND of Cumberland. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 117th Legislature has made changes in the numbers and jurisdictions of joint standing committees of the Legislature; and

Whereas, some statutory references to committees with 10 responsibility for reviewing appointments by the Governor are no longer correct; and

Whereas, review of nominations must be completed before the regular effective date of nonemergency legislation; and

16. Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 18 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 20 safety; now, therefore,

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17102, sub-§1, ¶D, as amended by PL 1993, c. 410, Pt. L, §17, is further amended to read:

D. Four persons appointed by the Governor and subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over aging,--veterans--and retirement and to confirmation by the Legislature:

32 (1) At least 2 of whom must be qualified through training or experience in the field of investments,
34 accounting, banking or insurance or as actuaries;

36 (2) One of whom must be selected from a list of 3
 nominees submitted by the Maine Retired Teachers'
 38 Association; and

40 (3) One of whom must be the recipient of a retirement allowance through the retirement system and be selected
42 from a list or lists of nominees submitted by retired state employees, retired participating local district
44 employees or a committee comprised of representatives of these groups; and

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §683, first ¶, as amended by PL 1991, c. 76, is further amended to read:

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The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004-D, subsection 1 to carry out the purposes

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stated in section 681, is created within the Department of Conservation, and in this chapter called the "commission." 2 The commission is charged with implementing this chapter in all of unorganized and deorganized areas of the State. The 4 the commission consists of 7 public members, none of whom may be state employees, who must be appointed by the Governor, subject 6 to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature energy---and---natural---resources 8 having jurisdiction over conservation matters and to confirmation by the Legislature, for staggered 4-year terms. Among the public members, there must be 10 4 who must be knowledgeable in at least one of each of the following areas: 12 commerce and industry; fisheries and wildlife; forestry; and conservation. Of the potential appointees to the 14 actively commission, the Governor shall seek qive and consideration to persons residing in or near the unorganized areas of the State and to persons residing on unorganized coastal 16 islands. At least 2 members must be residents within the 18 commission's jurisdiction.

Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §5011, first ¶, as amended by PL 1993, c. 685, Pt. B, §1, is further amended to read:

There is created and established the Department of 24 Conservation to preserve, protect and enhance the land resources of the State of Maine; to encourage the wise use of the scenic, 26 mineral and forest resources of the State of Maine and ensure that coordinated planning for the future allocation of lands for 28 recreational, forest production, mining and other public and private uses is effectively accomplished; and to provide for the 30 effective management of public lands in the State of Maine. The Department of Conservation consists of a Commissioner of Conservation, referred to in this Part as the "commissioner," 32 appointed by the Governor and subject to review by the joint 34 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy--and --natural --resources conservation matters and to 36 confirmation by the Legislature, to serve at the pleasure of the Governor; and the following entities as previously created or 38 established are incorporated into the Department of Conservation:

40 Sec. 4. 34-A MRSA §1401, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 459, §6, is amended to read:

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Appointment. The Governor shall appoint the Commissioner
 of Corrections, subject to review by the joint standing committee
 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health---and
 institutional-services corrections matters and to confirmation by
 the Senate, to serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

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Sec. 5. 38 MRSA §341-A, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 890, 50 Pt. A, §13 and affected by §40, is amended to read: 2 3. Commissioner. The commissioner shall-be is appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee
 4 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy-and natural resource matters and to confirmation by the Legislature.

A. The commissioner shall-serve <u>serves</u> at the pleasure of the Governor.

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B. When the State receives authority to issue permits under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, 33 United States
Code 1982, Section 1251 et seq., as amended, a person may not serve as commissioner who receives, or during the 2
years prior to appointment has received, a significant portion of income directly or indirectly from license or
permit holders or applicants for a license or permit under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act.

C. The commissioner may delegate duties assigned to the commissioner under this Title to staff of the department.

Sec. 6. 38 MRSA §341-C, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 890, Pt. A, §13 and affected by §40, is amended to read:

Appointments. The board shall--consist consists of 10
 members appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
 energy-and natural resource matters and to confirmation by the Legislature.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 32 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill corrects statutory references to joint standing 38 committees of the Legislature for the purpose of review of nominations by the Governor. These changes are necessary because 40 of recent changes in the number of committees and committee jurisdictions. Changes are made for the Board of Trustees of the 42 Maine State Retirement System, the Maine Land Use Regulation 44 Corrections, the Commissioner of Conservation, the Commissioner of 44 Board of Environmental Protection and the 45 Board of Environmental Protection.
