	following passage of this Act. The municipal officers of this

the legal votes are cast in favor of the Act, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay, and the Act takes effect 30
days after the date of the proclamation.

6 The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this
8 Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.'

10 Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read 12 consecutively.
