Sec. 4. 24-A MRSA §2837-C is enacted to read:

§2837-C. Coverage for mastectomy surgery

All group health policies providing coverage for mastectomy surgery, except those designed to cover only specific diseases, hospital indemnity or accidental injury, must provide coverage for reconstruction of the breast on which surgery has been performed and surgery and reconstruction of the other breast to produce a symmetrical appearance if the patient elects reconstruction and in the manner chosen by the patient and the physician.

Sec. 5. 24-A MRSA §4237 is enacted to read:

§4237. Coverage for mastectomy surgery

All individual or group coverage subject to this chapter that provides for mastectomy surgery must provide coverage for reconstruction of the breast on which surgery has been performed and surgery and reconstruction of the other breast to produce a symmetrical appearance if the patient elects reconstruction and in the manner chosen by the patient and the physician.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The expansion of health insurance reimbursement provisions related to breast reconstruction after mastectomy surgery will increase the costs of the state employee health insurance program during the current biennium by a total of \$53,500 in fiscal year 1995-96 and \$71,300 in fiscal year 1996-97. The General Fund share of these costs is \$26,800 and \$35,700; the Highway Fund share is \$9,600 and \$12,800; and the share for all other funds is \$17,100 and \$22,800. These additional personal services expenditures can be absorbed by all state departments and

agencies utilizing existing budgeted resources.

The Bureau of Insurance will incur some minor additional costs to process any new filings relative to these changes. These costs can be absorbed within the bureau's existing budgeted resources.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance. The amendment replaces the original bill and requires health care insurance and contracts providing coverage for mastectomy surgery, except for those policies covering specific diseases, hospital indemnity or accidental injury, to provide reconstructive surgery for both the breast on which surgery was performed and the other breast to produce a symmetrical appearance if the patient elects reconstruction and in the manner chosen by the patient and the physician. It applies to health maintenance organizations and nonprofit hospital and medical service corporations. It also repeals a statutory section that defines medically necessary mastectomy surgery.

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
