COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 127, L.D. 175

Currently state law requires that a convenience store that is open 24 hours a day have a drop safe, no more than \$50 in cash between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. and a sign at the entrance of the store that states that the cash register contains less than \$50 between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.

The original bill added to these requirements a 4th requirement for an alarm and a telephone within easy reach of the cashier. This amendment requires either a phone or an alarm and requires only that they be accessible to the employees.
