An Act to Limit Campaign Contributions in Legislative Races.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §1015, sub-§7 is enacted to read: 4 7. Time limitations; reporting. No individual, political committee, other committee, corporation or association may make 6 any contribution to a candidate for the Legislature later than the 12th day before the date on which an election is held. A 8 contribution made on the 12th day prior to the election must be 10 included in the report by the treasurer of a candidate for the Legislature as required under section 1017, subsection 3-A, 12 paragraph B. This subsection does not apply to postelection contributions. 14 Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §1056, sub-§3 is enacted to read: 16 3. Time limitations; reporting. No committee may make any 18 contribution to a candidate for the Legislature later than the 12th day before the date on which an election is held. A 20 contribution made on the 12th day prior to the election must be included in the report by the treasurer of a candidate for the 2.2 Legislature as required under section 1017, subsection 3-A, paragraph B. This subsection does not apply to postelection 24 contributions. 26 STATEMENT OF FACT 28 30 Under current elections law, the treasurer of a candidate for state Legislature is required to file a financial report at 32 least 6 days prior to the election; the report must be completed 12 days prior to the election. This bill prohibits any financial contributions to a candidate, except by the candidate or the 34 candidate's spouse, later than 12 days before the election. 36
