COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " to H.P. 148, L.D. 196

This bill establishes new supersport license fees that will generate total additional dedicated revenues of \$22,500 and \$45,000 to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife in fiscal years 1995-96 and 1996-97, respectively. Eighty percent of the revenue from these licenses is dedicated to the Support Landowners Program, which will require allocations of \$18,000 and \$36,000 in fiscal years 1995-96 and 1996-97, respectively. The remaining 20% is dedicated to the Sport Hunter Program, which will require allocations of \$4,500 and \$9,000 in fiscal years 1995-96 and 1996-97, respectively.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment repeals the supersport combination hunting license and replaces it with provisions that allow a person to purchase a supersport hunting, fishing or trapping license for a \$15 fee paid in addition to the regular license fee.

The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife must use 80% of those new fees for a Support Landowners Program targeted to improving landowner relations. The commissioner must use the remaining 20% of the revenues for the Sport Hunter Program targeted at combatting disrespect and misconduct and to improve the image of hunters. This amendment also adds an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
