	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 4	<pre>Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13080-B, sub-§§2 and 3, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 474, §1, are amended to read:</pre>
6	2. Membership; appointment. The authority is governed by a board of trustees composed of 11 13 voting members appointed by
8	the Governor and subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over economic
10	development matters and to confirmation by the Senate.
12	A. Trustees are appointed for 4-year terms except that, for initial appointments, 3 trustees are appointed to one-year
14	terms, 3 trustees to 2-year terms, 2 trustees to 3-year terms, 2 $\underline{4}$ trustees to 4-year terms and the commissioner
16	designated pursuant to paragraph D serves at the pleasure of the Governor.
18	B. A trustee continues to hold office until a successor is
20	appointed and qualified, but the term of the successor is not altered from the original expiration date of the
22	holdover trustee's term.
24	C. The Governor shall make 10 <u>12</u> appointments, of which no less than 7 must be from candidates who are residents of
26	Aroostook County and are nominated by the primary impact communities. The Governor shall appoint members who reflect
28	the diversity of interests represented by these communities. At least 4 of the remaining appointments must
30	be from candidates who are not residents of Aroostook County.
32	D. The Governor shall designate a commissioner of a department of State Government to be a voting, ex officion
34	member of the board of trustees.
36	3. Quorum. Six <u>Seven</u> members constitute a quorum. Six <u>Seven</u> affirmative votes are required for the board to take action

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill increases the number of members of the Loring Development Authority board of trustees from 11 members to 13. It also raises the number of members necessary for a quorum and limits the number of members who are from Aroostook County.
