22	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting

26	'An Act to Exempt Motor Homes from the Sunday Sales Law'
28	Further amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:
30	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
32	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
34	Whereas, motor homes are currently considered to be motor
36	vehicles in terms of the law that forbids Sunday sales; and
38	Whereas, the Federal Government treats motor homes as homes in terms of tax deductions; and
40	Whereas motor have dealers also sell travelitrailers, which
42	Whereas, motor home dealers also sell travel trailers, which can be sold on Sundays; and
44	Whereas, the great majority of motor homes are sold in the spring and summer; and

14	'Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §3203-A is enacted to read:
16	§3203-A. Motor homes
18	A person who is licensed in accordance with Title 29-A, section 951 and whose primary business is the buying and selling
20	of new motor homes is exempt from section 3203 as it relates to
22	that person's primary business. A "motor home" means a motor vehicle that is primarily designed as temporary living quarters and:

38	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:
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42	'FISCAL NOTE
42	This bill may reduce prosecutions for Class E crimes. If
44	jail sentences are reduced, the savings to the counties are estimated to be \$83.22 per day per prisoner. These savings do

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not affect reimbursement by the State. The reduction in the

number of prosecutions that would have resulted in a jail

sentence and the resulting savings to the county jail system are

expected to be insignificant.

The Judicial Department may realize some minor savings from reductions of workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of cases that will no longer be filed in the court system. Reductions in the collection of fines may decrease General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The original bill exempts recreational vehicles from the Sunday sales law. This amendment clarifies that it is motor homes that are exempted. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
