if a representative of the United States Natural Resources Conservation Service, formerly known as the Soil Conservation Service, has approved the repair. Repair of more than 50% of a structure is exempt from permitting only if the municipality in which the activity is to occur regulates that activity under the mandatory shoreland zoning laws and the municipality has approved a permit for the activity.
