2 **Preamble. Whereas,** the Department of the Secretary of State,
Bureau of Motor Vehicles currently requires as many as 4 separate
forms for the sale of a motor vehicle; and

4 **Whereas,** this amount of paperwork is costly and
6 time-consuming for the State, the dealer and the buyer; now,
therefore, be it

8 **Sec. 1. Multipurpose vehicle sales form. Resolved:** That the
10 Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles,
in conjunction with the sales tax division of the Department of
12 Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Taxation, shall
develop one form to function as a replacement for all forms that
14 the Bureau of Motor Vehicles currently requires to be executed
and returned to them in conjunction with the sale of a vehicle.
16 This form must be arranged so that notification of a sale
required by the Bureau of Taxation can be made directly by the
18 seller to the Bureau of Taxation.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This resolve requires that the Bureau of Motor Vehicles
develop one form that will incorporate all notification
26 requirements of the bureau when a motor vehicle is sold.
Currently, 4 forms are required for this purpose.

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
