An Act to Allow Municipal Officials to Approve the Use of Flashing Lights by Fire Department Members.

2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 4	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA 2054 , sub- 2 , \mathbb{F} , as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, 2 and affected by Pt. B, 5 , is amended to read:
6	F. Only vehicles listed in this paragraph, rural mail vehicles as provided in paragraph C, subparagraph (5) and
8	school buses may be equipped with, display or use a red auxiliary or emergency light.

12	(1) Emergency lights used on an ambulance, an emergency medical service vehicle, a fire department vehicle, a fire vehicle or a hazardous material
14	response vehicle must emit a red light or a combination of red and white light.

18	(2) The municipal officers,
20	municipal or volunteer fire department to use a flashing red signal light not more than 5 inches in
22	diameter on a vehicle. The light may be displayed but may be used only while the member is en route to or at
24	the scene of a fire or other emergency. The light must be mounted as near as practicable above the
26	registration plate on the front of the vehicle or on the dashboard. A light mounted on the dashboard must
28	be shielded so that the emitted light does not interfere with the operator's vision.
30	(3) Members of an emergency medical service licensed
32	by Maine Emergency Medical Services may display and use on a vehicle a flashing red signal light of the same
34	proportion, in the same location and under the same conditions as those permitted municipal and volunteer
36	firefighters, when authorized by the chief official of the emergency medical service.

40	STATEMENT OF FACT
42	Under current law, in order for a member of a municipal or volunteer fire department to use a flashing red signal light,
44	approval must be obtained from the municipal officers. This bill gives the municipal officers the ability to designate an official
46	who may give permission.
