Be	it	enacted	by	the	Peor	ole d	of the	State	of	Maine	as	follows:
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Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §13733, sub-§1, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 710, §5, is amended to read:

D. Have possessed at the time of initial licensure as a pharmacist such other qualifications necessary to have been eligible for licensure at that time in this State, except that if the state requirement of graduation from a pharmacy degree program accredited by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education applies, this requirement must be waived for an applicant who, notwithstanding paragraph E, has engaged in the practice of pharmacy for a period of at least 5 years and who has passed the national pharmacy examination prepared by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy;

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STATEMENT OF FACT

22 This bill provides that if an applicant for licensure as a pharmacist by reciprocity is required to have graduated from a program accredited by 24 the American Pharmaceutical Education, this requirement must be waived for an 26 applicant who has 5 years' experience as a pharmacist and has passed the national pharmacy examination prepared by the National 28 Association of Boards of Pharmacy.
