An Act to Require Reporting by Political Action Committees That Endorse or Provide Funds to Local Municipal Candidates.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §2502, sub-§3 is enacted to read: 4 3. Reports by political action committees. A political 6 action committee that accepts contributions, incurs obligations or makes expenditures in excess of \$50 in any year to support, 8 defeat or influence in any way a municipal election, candidate or political committee or another political action committee in a city with a population of 10,000 or more is governed by Title 10 21-A, chapter 13, subchapter IV, except that the notices of appointment of treasurer and campaign reports must be filed with 12 the municipal clerk instead of the Commission on Governmental 14 Ethics and Election Practices. 16

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires political action committees that accept 20 contributions, incur obligations or make expenditures in elections for municipal office to register and report to the 22 municipal clerk. Under current law only municipal candidates must file campaign reports.
