Legislators' dental insurance benefits effective December 1, 1996 will result in a General Fund deappropriation to the Legislature
of \$82,900 in fiscal year 1996-97. Beginning in fiscal year 1997-98, annual health insurance savings will approximate
\$165,900.'
STATEMENT OF FACT
This amendment replaces the bill and allows the State to contribute 80% of the employees cost of health benefits after December 1, 1996. Legislators may still participate in the
health plan by paying 20% of the premium. The amendment also prohibits the State from paying any portion of the Legislators'
share of the dental plan. The amendment also adds the necessary fiscal note.

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
