2	Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §169 is enacted to read:
4	§169. General immunity for noise
6	A person who owns a shooting range for use of a rifle, a
8	pistol or silhouette, skeet, trap, blackpowder or other shooting equipment is exempt and immune from civil or criminal prosecution
10	in any matter relating to noise or noise pollution if the shooting range does not generate a sound level in excess of 68

	This bill holds owners of shooting ranges exempt and immune

from civil and criminal prosecution for matters relating to noise or noise pollution at the shooting range as long as the shooting range does not generate a sound level in excess of 68 decibels.
