This amendment replaces the requirement that school boards notify local law enforcement officers when a student is habitually truant with a provision that permits school boards to notify officers. The amendment adds a provision that permits an officer to offer to transport a truant to the appropriate school provided the truant and the truant's parent or guardian grant verbal permission.
