elects to pursue electronic benefit transfer systems for certain programs.

The net amount of future costs or future savings associated with implementation of an electronic benefit transfer system can not be estimated at this time.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment removes the waiver application date of October 20, 1995 for the electronic benefit delivery program. It authorizes the Department of Human Services to establish an electronic benefit transfer system. It allows for participation in the electronic benefit transfer system by departments other than the Department of Human Services and for programs in addition to Aid to Families with Dependent Children, food stamps and Medicaid. It changes the date for the report to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources from January 1, 1996 to January 1, 1997.

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This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
