Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §4358, sub-§2, ¶E, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 299, §1, is amended to read:

E. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any modular home that meets the--provisions--of--the--municipality's building-code-er,--in-the--absence-of--a-municipal--building ede,---the--Building--Officials--and--Code--Administrators National--Code-(1990),--11th--edition,--as--published-by--the Building--Officials--and--Code--Administrators--International, Incorporated--and--as--subsequently--revised--and--amended, construction standards for state-certified manufactured homes adopted pursuant to Title 10, section 9042 must be allowed in all zones where other single-family homes are allowed.
