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Sec. 1. 13 MRSA §708, as enacted by PL 1969, c. 411, is amended to read:

§708. Interpretation; liability

This chapter does not modify the relationship between a person rendering and a person receiving professional service nor does it modify the liability of a person rendering professional service to a person receiving professional service. The liability of shareholders for the debts of and claims against a professional corporation shall—be is the same as that of shareholders of a business corporation; except that, in the case of liability arising out of the rendering of professional service+, such liability of professionals extends, jointly and severally, to those shareholders who personally and directly participate, supervise or control another person who directly and personally participates in rendering that portion of a professional service that is performed negligently or in breach of any other legal duty.

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1.--Liability-not-modified.-This-chapter-does-not-modify-the liability-of-the-person-rendering-to-the-person-receiving-the service;-and

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2. -- Liability-extended. That-liability-shall-extend, -jointly and-severally, -and-regardless-of-fault, -to-those-shareholders participating-in-a-professional-capacity-in-such-rendering.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to make Maine as attractive as other states for the establishment of professional service corporations limited liability companies and facilitate business creation and development. Under current law, the liability of shareholders for the debts of and claims against professional corporations arising out of the rendering of professional service extends to those shareholders participating in a professional capacity in such rendering. This bill changes the law governing liability in such situations to extend liability to those shareholders who personally and directly participate, supervise or control another person who directly or personally participates in rendering the service negligently performed or is in breach of a legal duty.

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
