20 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " B" to S.P. 147, L.D. 333, Bill, "An
Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of
\$20,000,000 for Landfill Closure and Remediation"

22 Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting
24 the following:

26 **'An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of**
28 **\$18,000,000 for Landfill Closure and Remediation; for Small**
30 **Community Water Pollution Facilities; for the Removal of**
32 **State-owned Underground Storage Tanks; and to Investigate, Abate,**
Clean Up and Mitigate Threats to the Public Health and
Environment from Uncontrolled Hazardous Substance Sites'

34 Further amend the bill in the preamble in the last 2 lines
(page 1, lines 5 and 6 in L.D.) by striking out the following:
36 "and for the purchase of recycling equipment" and inserting in
its place the following: '; for small community water pollution
38 control facilities; for the removal of state-owned underground
storage tanks; and to investigate, abate, clean up and mitigate
40 threats to the public health and environment from uncontrolled
hazardous substance sites or other hazardous waste discharges'

42 Further amend the bill in section 1 in the headnote in the
2nd line (page 1, line 11 in L.D.) by inserting after the
44 following: "landfills" the following: '; for small community water
46 pollution control facilities; for the removal of state-owned underground
storage tanks; and to investigate, abate, clean up and mitigate threats to the
48 public health and environment from uncontrolled hazardous substance
sites or other hazardous waste discharges'

 water pollution control facilities; for the removal of
 8 state-owned underground storage tanks; and to investigate, abate,
 clean up and mitigate threats to the public health and
 10 environment from uncontrolled hazardous substance sites or other
 hazardous waste discharges' and in the 4th line from the end
 12 (page 1, line 17 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "5" and
 inserting in its place the following: '10'

14 Further amend the bill in section 5 in the 3rd line (page 1,
 line 45 in L.D.) by inserting after the following "supervision of
 16 the" the following: 'Department of Administrative and Financial
 18 Services for the removal of state-owned underground storage tanks
 and the' and in the last line (page 1, line 47 in L.D.) by
 20 inserting after the following: "landfills" the following: '
 for small community water pollution control facilities; and to
 22 investigate, abate and clean up and mitigate threats to the
 public health and environment from uncontrolled hazardous
 24 substance sites'

26 Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 6 and
 inserting in its place the following:

28 **'Sec. 6. Allocations from General Fund bond issue.** The proceeds
 30 of the sale of bonds must be expended as designated in the
 following schedule.

Further amend the bill in section 10 by striking out all of the question (page 2, lines 47 to 49 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

"Do you favor an \$18,000,000 bond issue for the following purposes: \$10,000,000 for the closure and remediation of municipal solid waste landfills; \$1,000,000 for the Small Community Program; \$3,000,000 for the removal of state-owned underground storage tanks; and \$4,000,000 to investigate, abate and mitigate threats to the public health and environment from uncontrolled hazardous substance sites or other hazardous waste discharges?"

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The estimated cost of sending this bond issue out to referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the First Regular Session of the 117th Legislature. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional referendum costs an additional \$7,000.

If approved by the voters, the total cost of this bond issue is estimated to be \$23,049,000 with principal payments of \$18,000,000 and interest payments of approximately \$5,049,000.'

This amendment is the minority report of the committee.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to S.P. 147, L.D. 333

2 It decreases the amount available for the closure and
remediation of municipal solid waste landfills from \$20,000,000
4 to \$10,000,000; it adds \$1,000,000 for the Small Community
Program as it relates to water pollution facilities; it adds
6 \$3,000,000 for the removal of state-owned underground storage
tanks; and it adds \$4,000,000 to investigate, abate, clean up and
8 mitigate threats to the public health and environment from
uncontrolled substance sites.

10 The amendment also increases the term of the bond from 5
years to 10 years and adds a fiscal note.
