An Act to Increase the Debt Limit of the Richmond Utilities District.

Presented by Senator McCORMICK of Kennebec. Cosponsored by Senator: STEVENS of Androscoggin, Representative: SHIAH of Bowdoinham. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it is necessary that this legislation be enacted as an emergency in order for the Richmond Utilities District to immediately borrow money to upgrade 2 pump stations and to construct new sewers and storm drains to correct a seriously overloaded wastewater treatment plant; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1961. c. 154, §14-A, as amended by P&SL 1993, c. 66, §1, is amended by amending the first sentence to read:

22 For accomplishing the purpose of this Act, the district, by vote of its board of trustees, without district vote except as provided, is authorized to borrow money temporarily and to issue 24 its negotiable notes; and for the purpose of renewing and 26 refunding the indebtedness so created, of paying necessary expenses and liabilities incurred under the provisions of this Act, and in acquiring properties, paying damages, laying pipes, 28 mains, sewers, drains and conduits, purchasing, constructing, maintaining and operating a water system and a sewerage system 30 and making renewals, additions, extensions and improvements to 32 such systems and to cover interest payments during the period of construction, the Richmond Utilities District, by votes of its board of trustees, without district vote except as provided, is 34 also authorized to issue, from time to time, bonds, notes or 36 other evidences of indebtedness of the district in such amount or amounts, bearing interest at such rate or rates, and having such 38 terms and provisions as the trustees determine; except that the total indebtedness of the district may not exceed the sum of \$1,500,000 \$2,000,000 at any one time outstanding and in the case 40 of a vote by the trustees to authorize bonds or notes to pay for the acquisition of property, except for the original acquisition 42 of property of Richmond Water Works, for the cost of a water 44 system or sewerage system or part of a water system or sewerage system, for renewals or additions or for other improvements in 46 the nature of capital costs, the estimated cost of which singly or in the aggregate included in any one financing is \$30,000 or more, but not for renewing or refunding existing indebtedness or 48 to pay for maintenance, repairs or for current expenses, notice of the proposed debt and of the general purpose or purposes for 50

which it was authorized must be given by the clerk by publication 2 at least once in a newspaper having a general circulation in the Town of Richmond.

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Sec. 2. Emergency clause; referendum; effective date. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when 6 approved only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the Richmond Utilities District, resident in the 8 district, at the next regular town or at a special town meeting 10 to be called and held for that purpose. The election must be called, advertised and conducted according to the law related to municipal elections except that the municipal officers of the 12 town are not required to prepare for posting, nor the town clerk 14to post, a new list of voters and, for the purpose of registration of voters, the board of voter registration must be 16 in session on the secular day next preceding the special election. The town clerk of the town shall prepare the required ballots, on which the town clerk shall reduce the subject matter 18 of this Act to the following question:

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"Do you favor amending the charter of the Richmond Utilities District by changing the debt limit of the district from \$1,500,000 to \$2,000,000?"

The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the word "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. This Act takes effect immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election.

30 The result of the vote must be declared by the municipal officers of the Town of Richmond and due certificate thereof must 32 be filed by the town clerk with the Secretary of State.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill raises the current debt limit of the Richmond 38 Utilities District from \$1,500,000 to \$2,000,000.
