Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §17101, as amended by PL 1989, c. 700, Pt. A, §74, is further amended to read:

### §17101. Intent

The intent of this chapter is to promote creative improvement in the schools of the State. The Commissioner of Education shall promote innovative projects by means of grants to teachers, school administrative units ef, private schools approved for tuition purposes or groups of school administrative units formed for the purpose of providing improved educational opportunity through the sharing of resources among the member units. It is not the intent of this chapter to provide funds for programs or services normally provided by those school systems. Project dissemination will be accomplished through the department through instructional support group staff. The use of state, regional and national diffusion networks will be encouraged.
