2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7463-A, sub-§14** is enacted to read:

6 14. Former prisoners of war. At least 50 of the moose
8 permits authorized for issuance by the commissioner under
10 subsection 4 must be reserved initially for issuance to former
12 prisoners of war. If more than 50 former prisoners of war apply
14 for a permit in one year, the commissioner shall issue permits in
16 accordance with subsections 6 and 7. If fewer than 50 prisoners
18 of war apply for a permit in one year, the balance of permits
20 available under this subsection becomes available pursuant to the
22 other provisions of this section. A permittee under this
24 subsection must meet the qualifications of subsections 4 and 5
and is subject to the requirements and limitations of subsections
9, 10 and 11.

20 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

22 This bill requires the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and
24 Wildlife to set aside 50 moose hunting permits for former
prisoners of war.
