Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §14202, sub-§3-A is enacted to read:

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3-A. Demonstrator. "Demonstrator" means any person who engages on behalf of a manufacturer, wholesaler, retailer or distributor in demonstrating the use of any machine or other article pertaining to cosmetology or barbering without charge to the person who is subject to the demonstration. The term "demonstrator" does not include one who performs such a demonstration for the benefit of persons who have a certificate to practice cosmetology or barbering under this chapter or under the licensing provisions of any other state.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill provides a definition of "demonstrator" which was omitted in the Act that created the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology by merging the State Board of Barbers and the State Board of Cosmetology.
