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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment establishes the Short-term Medical Plan to succeed the Maine Health Program from April 1, 1995 to June 30, 1995. It deletes portions of Maine Health Program laws that are not necessary after the termination of the program and not applicable to the Short-term Medical Plan. It corrects a cross-reference to the Maine Health Program in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 396-G, subsection 6 concerning hospital finances.

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
