must use reformulated gasoline. It is the intent of the Legislature that reformulated gasoline not be sold in the State and that the United States Environmental Protection Agency respect that intent by expeditiously approving the petition.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

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FISCAL NOTE

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The Department of Environmental Protection will incur some minor additional costs to petition the federal Environmental Protection Agency for an exemption from the current requirements regarding the sale of reformulated gasoline in certain counties in the State. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

This bill may increase prosecutions for civil violations. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the bill. It requires the Commissioner of Environmental Protection to immediately petition the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency to remove all Maine counties from the list of areas required to sell reformulated gasoline. It also prohibits the sale of reformulated gasoline in the State unless sale of non-reformulated gasoline is prohibited by federal law. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
